He also completed a work-integrated Master's degree in 'General Business Management' in 2021. In 2022, he served as interim head of KTG, officially taking up his post as managing director on 1 January 2023. Pascal Rastetter is a member of the Tourism Policy Working Group at the German Tourism Association (Deutscher Tourismusverband e. V.). Since 1 August 2025, he has been CFO of The World Games 2029 Karlsruhe GmbH. He also works as a freelance lecturer, teaching “Destination Management” and “Tourism Policy” at the DHBW Lörrach. In his spare time, he is an enthusiastic referee and officiates matches up to the Verbandsliga level of the Baden Football Association, as well as in the DFB Futsal Bundesliga.
